Temple Emanuel Sinai Worcester, MA

Planning Study followed by design and documentation for renovations and additions to a recently integrated congregation that would be moving into a building previously occupied by one of the two original congregations.

Temple Rodef Shalom Falls Church, VA

Planning Study and design/documentation for the expansion and renovation of a large Reform congregation outside of Washington, DC. Project included a new chapel, a new classroom wing and a clergy suite along with renovations to the existing facility.

Arch Street Presbyterian Church Philadelphia, PA

Master Plan for the expansion and preservation of this historic Center City church. Plan includes creating a new accessible entrance linking the church to the adjacent brownstone that serves as offices and auxiliary spaces.

Beth Israel Congregation Metairie, LA

A new 6,000 sf Modern Orthodox shul for a congregation that lost its building to Katrina. The building contains an intimate sanctuary seating 70, a social hall with a kosher kitchen and meeting rooms and offices.

Congregation Rodeph Shalom, Past President Membership Committee, Former Chair Master Plan, Former Chair Rabbi Search Task Force, Former Chair Michael is past president of Congregation Rodeph Shalom in Center City Philadelphia. He chaired the Master Plan Task Force which oversaw the design and construction of the synagogue's \$15 million addition. He and his family have lived in Center City Philadelphia for over forty years where he is an Emeritus member of the Board of Directors of the Queen Village Neighbors Association. Michael chaired the Queen Village Zoning Committee for ten years and was responsible for co-authoring the design guidelines and leading the effort that made Queen Village Philadelphia's first Neighborhood Conservation District.

In 2009, Michael was appointed by Mayor Nutter to the Board of Directors of the Delaware River Waterfront Corporation where he serves on the Planning Committee which is overseeing the Master Plan for the central waterfront.

He has been a guest lecturer at the University of Pennsylvania Weitzman School of Design, the AIA Design on the Delaware program, a Penn symposium on the Philadelphia Rowhouse, and several neighborhood civic associations.
